

Edinburgh Napier University English Language Entry Requirements for Postgraduate Research Study

Edinburgh Napier University must ensure all applicants whose first language is not English have sufficient English language skills to enable them to successfully complete their programme of study or research with us.

As a Highly Trusted Sponsor of Tier 4 student visas, the University is also responsible for assessing all non-EEA applicants' English ability as meeting the required standard (at least B2 on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages – CEFR) to enter the UK and for obtaining verification of this in the form of a recognised test or qualification.

The text below provides a short summary of the main English Language qualifications that are accepted by the University as acceptable for entry to the University.

Nationals of Majority English Speaking Countries AND study within

If you are a National of AND living in one of the countries below, you will **not** have to provide evidence of holding an approved English Language qualification/test.

If you are a National from another country (not listed above) who has undertaken qualifications in one of the countries above you will not have to provide evidence of holding an approved English Language qualification/test provided that:

- You have completed more than 2 years of continuous study in English in one of the countries listed above including either:
- an honours degree (class I or 2:1) which has been fully taught and examined in English, with a minimum 60% in the project/dissertation OR
- a Masters degree which has been fully taught and examined in English, with a minimum 60% mark in the project/dissertation and a minimum 60% overall module average.

The degree qualifications must have been awarded no more than two years before the expected registration date. Where your previous studies are outwith the two year time frame, then evidence would be required that assures the University that you have been appropriately maintaining your English language skills in work/academic endeavour, otherwise an approved English Language qualification/test would be required.

Countries where we accept that degrees are taught and examined in English

If you have undertaken your school and university studies in one of the countries listed below you may be exempted from having to provide evidence of holding an approved English Language qualification/test provided that:

- You have completed more than 2 years of continuous study in English in one of the countries listed above including either:
- an honours degree (class I or 2:1) which has been fully taught and examined in English, with a minimum 60% in the project/dissertation OR
- a Masters degree which has been fully taught and examined in English, with a minimum 60% mark in the project/dissertation and a minimum 60% overall module average.

The degree qualifications must have been awarded no more than two years before the expected registration date. Where your previous studies are outwith the two year time frame, then evidence would be required that assures the University that you have been appropriately maintaining your English language skills in work/academic endeavour, otherwise an approved English Language qualification/test would be required.

Applicants within the EEA/European Union

For Postgraduate Research entry if you are from the EEA/European Union (or have undertaken your degree studies in the EEA/European Union) you must normally produce evidence that your undergraduate degree has been taught and assessed in English within 2 years of the registration date. Where your previous studies were out with the two year time frame, then evidence would be required that assures the University that you have been

appropriately maintaining your English language skills in a work/academic context, otherwise an approved English Language qualification/test would be required.

Secure English Language Test (SELT)

If you do not meet one of the exemptions listed above then you will be required by the University to undertake a Secure English Language Test. The following SELT's are currently approved by the UKVI for Tier 4 applications AND are accepted by the University for Postgraduate Research study.
