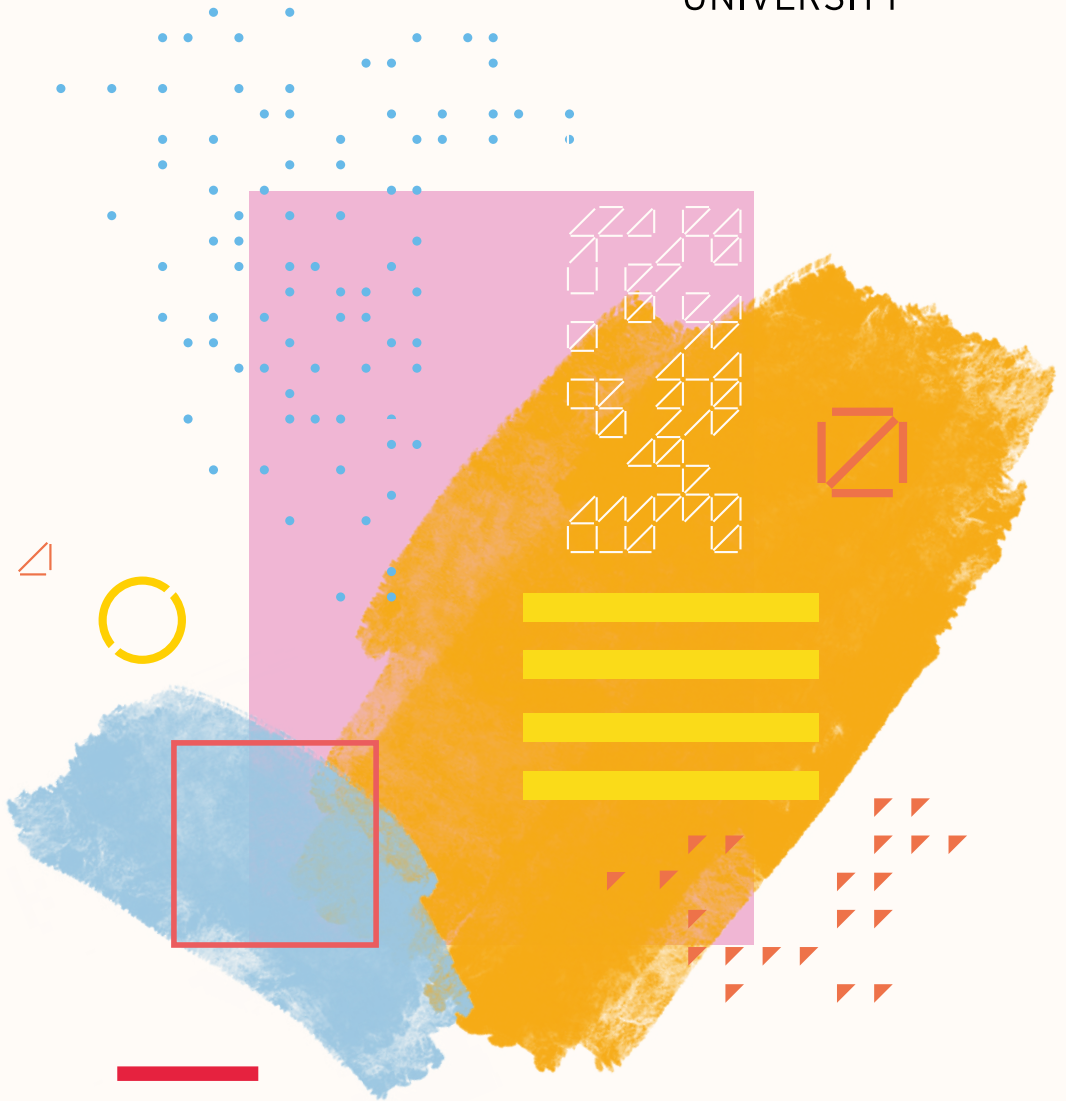

PROGRESSING FROM COLLEGE TO UNIVERSITY

Edinburgh Napier University accepts the highest number of articulating students in the Edinburgh region, more than all of the other Edinburgh Universities combined.

Articulation/Advanced Entry Explained

An articulation route is a pathway from an HNC/D that is mapped to the relevant degree programme and formally agreed between a college and the university. These routes are reviewed regularly to ensure that the content of the HN course aligns to the relevant year of the degree, to ensure a smooth transition.

Articulation is the process where you are given full credit for your college qualification which means you could transition from an HNC to year 2 and an HND to year 3 of a degree programme, this can also be referred to as advanced entry.

Many of our degree courses allow advanced entry, but this will also depend on your college HN and the course you wish to study at university. For some courses full credit cannot be offered as the HN does not contain sufficient units to allow articulation or because of professional accreditation qualifications that are taught in Year 1 and Year 2 of the degree. Our **entry requirements** can be found at the back of this booklet, and on the course pages of our website.

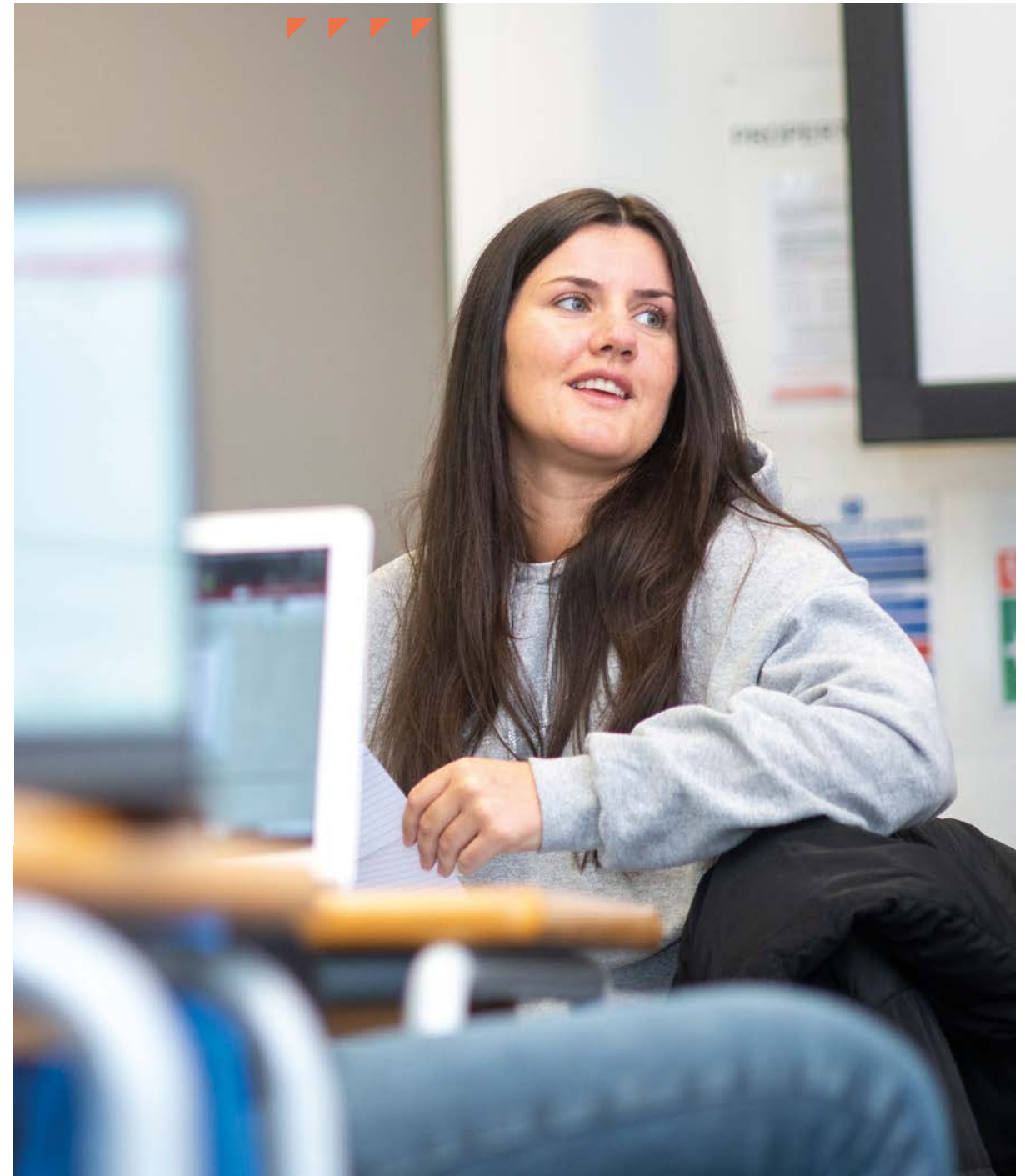

WHAT IS WIDENING PARTICIPATION?

Widening participation (WP) is a strategy between governments and the higher education sector in the UK, to support students from particular backgrounds that are traditionally underrepresented at universities and colleges, to pursue these paths (UCAS, 2024).

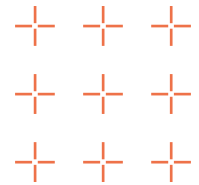
At Edinburgh Napier University, we are highly committed to widening access and we realise that everyone's path into higher education is unique, and everyone may not have the same opportunity at higher education due to additional barriers. Widening Participation aims to provide equal opportunities, ensuring that there is support available to you through university, to allow you to achieve your goals. Furthermore, depending on your widening participation eligibility you may be able to receive a minimum offer when applying to us, as we take into account the additional barriers you may have experienced.

The Widening Participation team at Edinburgh Napier provide, information, advice, guidance, and tailored support for these groups:

- Care-experienced
- Are a young person estranged from your family
- Student carers
- Attended a Schools for Higher Education Programme (SHEP) such as LEAPS, LIFT OFF, Aspire North or Focus West
- Have completed a SWAP (Scottish Widening Access Programme) access course
- Are a government-recognised refugee or have asylum status
- Are from an SIMD20* postcode (SIMD area 1 = SIMD20)
- Are a student joining year 2 or 3 of a degree after completing an HNC or HND at a Scottish college
- Part of Armed Forces Community



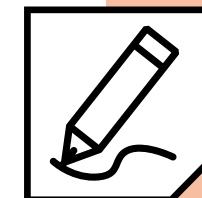
HOW DO I IDENTIFY AS A WIDENING PARTICIPATION STUDENT?



It is very important that all relevant fields within your UCAS application are completed. You can also use your personal statement to highlight any further contextual information.

Furthermore, when you are looking at entry requirements at Edinburgh Napier University, and you are within the Widening Participation criteria, you can look at the minimum offer entry requirements. (Our minimum offer entry requirements are the grades that applicants need to achieve by the time they enter the University where they meet one of the criteria within our contextual admissions policy).

Once we are aware of your Widening Participation eligibility, this will be treated sensitively any disclosed information will only be shared with those who are responsible for your application such as the admissions team, and if any additional support requirements are required, we will inform the necessary departments of this.

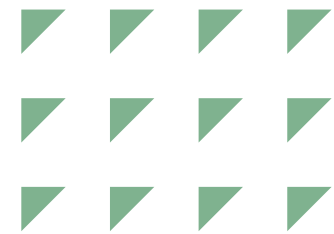

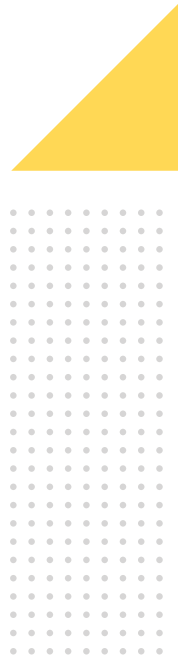
We were the **first university in Scotland** to receive a gold award from the MOD's Defence Employer Recognition Scheme for our educational support and commitment to the armed forces community.

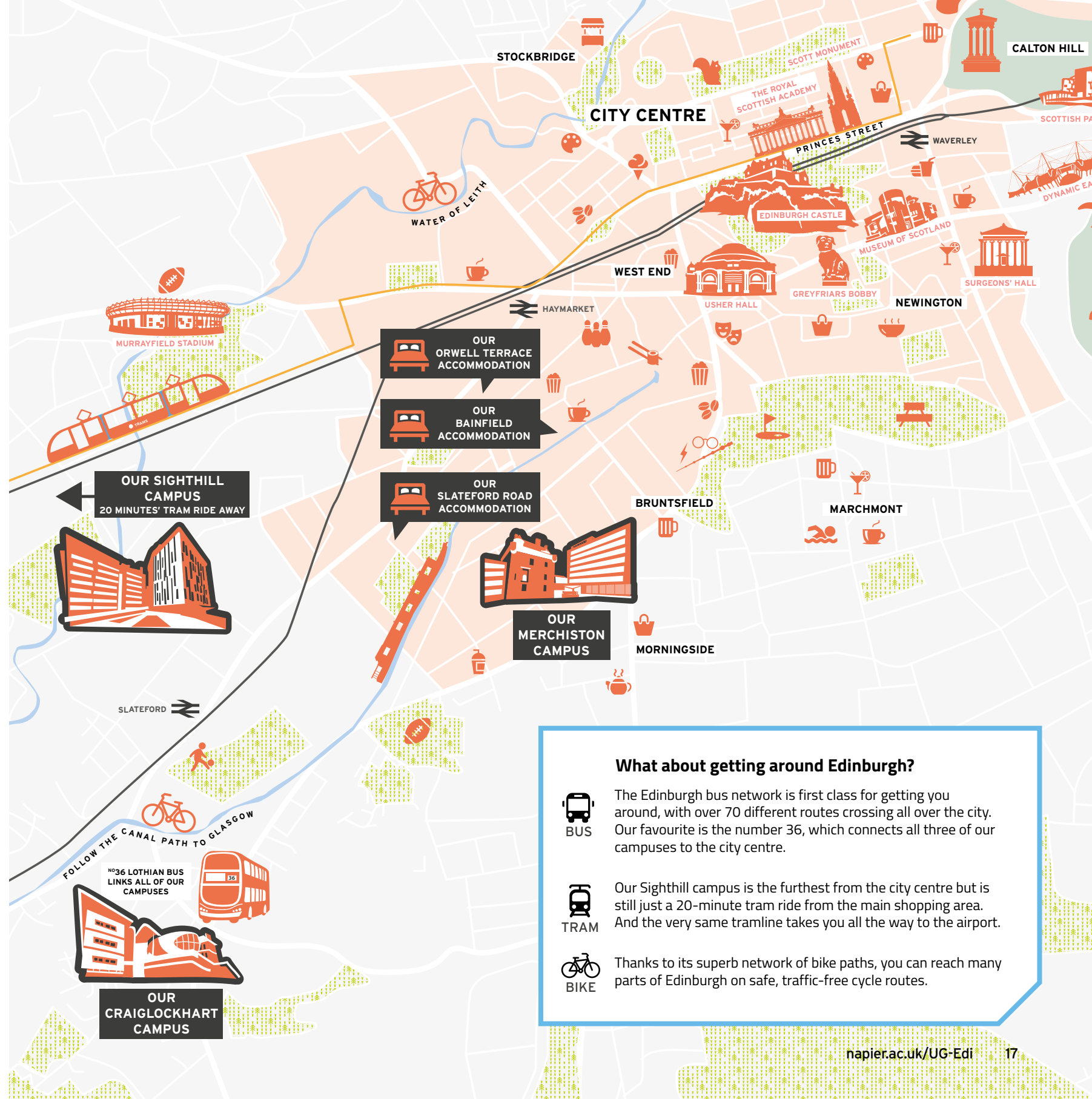

With great transport links whether you choose to move to the city, or commute, Edinburgh is a great place to be.

Commuting? Well, Edinburgh is a:

- 45-minute train from Glasgow
- 25-minute train from Livingston
- 25-minute train from Falkirk
- 35-minute train from Dunfermline
- 45-minute train from Stirling
- 1 hour 30-minute train from Newcastle
- 2 hours 26-minute train from Aberdeen



What about getting around Edinburgh?



The Edinburgh bus network is first class for getting you around, with over 70 different routes crossing all over the city. Our favourite is the number 36, which connects all three of our campuses to the city centre.



Our Sighthill campus is the furthest from the city centre but is still just a 20-minute tram ride from the main shopping area. And the very same tramline takes you all the way to the airport.



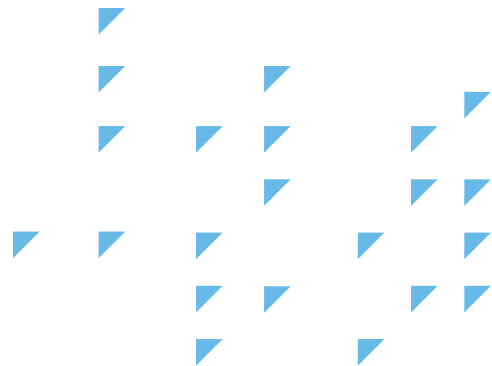
Thanks to its superb network of bike paths, you can reach many parts of Edinburgh on safe, traffic-free cycle routes.

OUR CAMPUSES

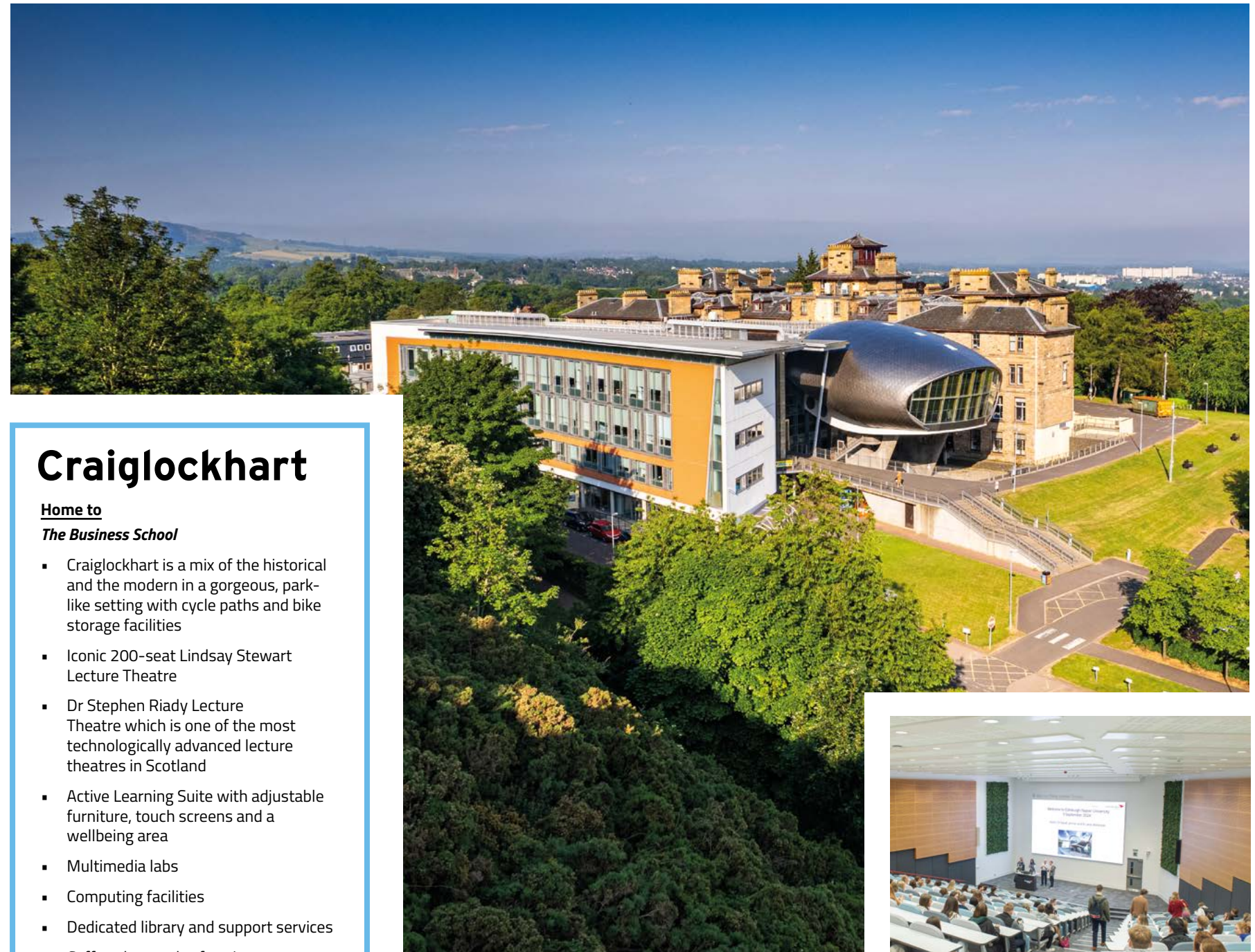
We have three campuses, each defined by distinctive features and course-specific facilities, as well as by the people (like you!) who study with us.

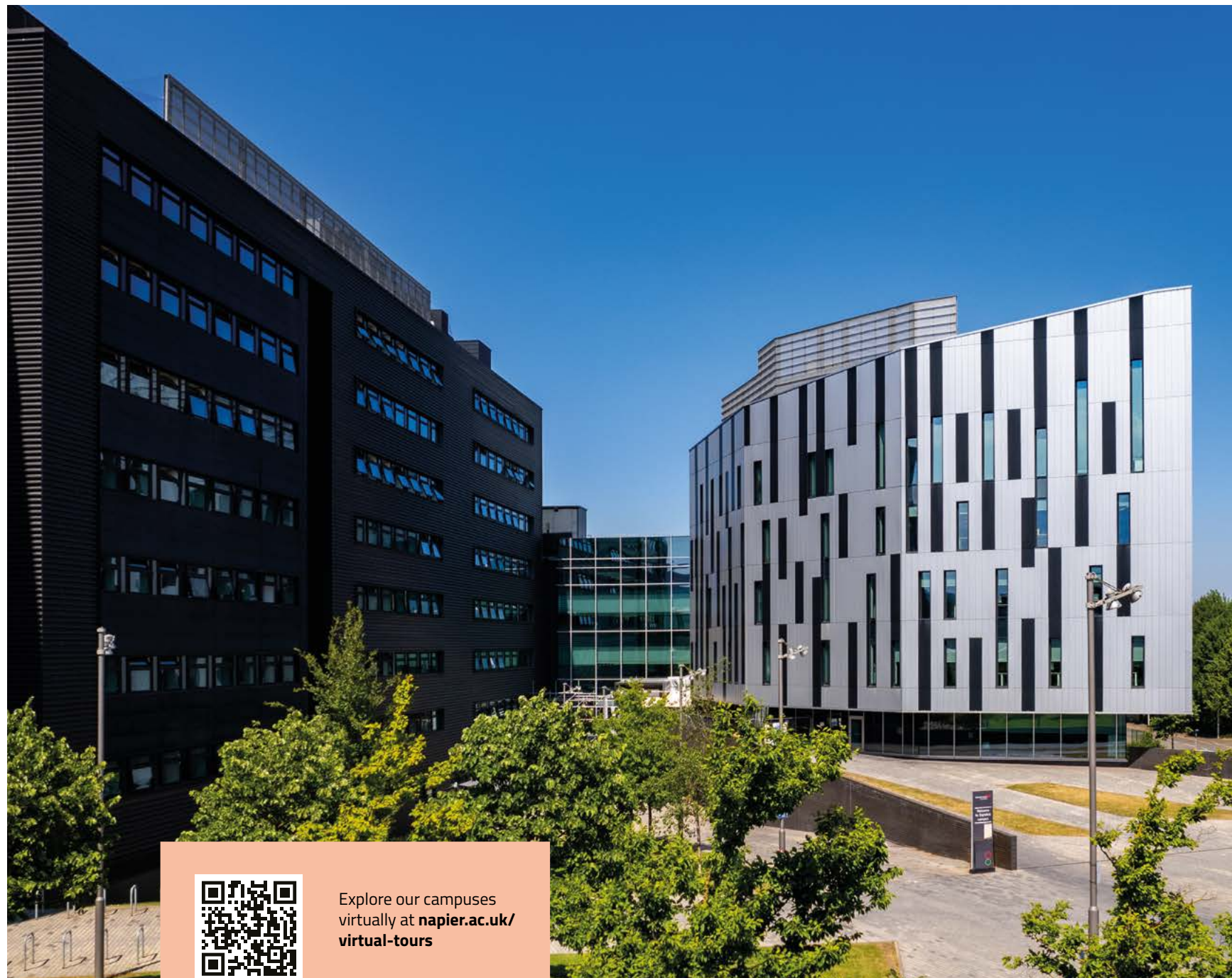

Most rooms are en-suite, and you'll have a double bed, a desk and high-speed Wi-Fi. You'll share a kitchen and living space with a communal smart TV and have access to a central laundry.

All our accommodation is comfortable and convenient – you'll find supermarkets, bars, restaurants, and sometimes cinemas, are all nearby.

Myles Robertson, BA Business Management with Entrepreneurship

I started at Edinburgh Napier last year as a direct entrant to 3rd year. My experience over the last eleven months has been truly amazing because I have exposed myself to as many opportunities as possible thanks to the wide range of support and mentorship available at Edinburgh Napier University.

My advice to students who are coming from college is not to worry about anything too much because the range of support available makes the transition so smooth. It's important to educate yourself on the range of support available from all of the departments and to take advantage of it whenever you need. If you ever feel like nothing makes sense or you're struggling, there will always be people who will be happy to help you figure it out!

Every student at Napier is allocated a PDT (personal development tutor). My PDT has been extremely valuable, I can email them with any issue I'm having with academic work but also with university life.

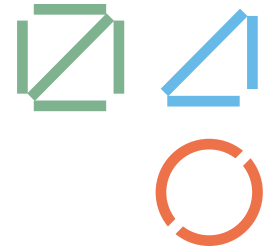
When starting, I was unsure about referencing and was slightly intimidated by the level of reading I was expected to do as a third-year student. Using the university portal, I booked myself onto workshops in referencing, exam preparation, academic reading and writing. The workshops explained everything in detail and I had the chance to practice and receive constructive feedback on the coursework I was working on. It put me totally at ease seeing how many other students were there and the one-on-one feedback from an Academic Skills Adviser definitely helped me achieve solid grades in my coursework!

The Careers department provides a large range of opportunities to students such as jobs, trips, employment events and more. The department has an online portal ("My Future") where students can book into workshops in employability, graduate schemes, teamwork, interview skills and everything

else related to student opportunities out with academia. It has been my primary source of opportunities while at university and has helped me easily build on my soft skills, engage with potential future employers and to partake in valuable opportunities alongside my studies.

Since starting at Edinburgh Napier, I've had a huge amount of support and have taken advantage of the range of opportunities which are available to me. When I started, the Societies offering at Napier didn't happen to appeal much to me, so I created my own Society through the student association based around Blockchain & Fintech, which is a strong interest of mine. Doing this has helped me build on my management and networking skills, introduced me to some interesting people (academics, other students and professional from outside the university) and helped me build on an interest while having some fun outside of my studies.

At Napier, every student is treated the same whether you are a direct entrant or have been there since the first year. I've come to see university as a few years where everyone around you is there to support you in what you are doing and shower you with opportunities. All you have to do is grab them while you can. You will have some serious fun but remember that university isn't forever, so you have to make the most of it while you're there!

When you join us you become part of our community and we pride ourselves on helping our community to flourish by providing the very best support that we can.

Through student-focused services and caring staff, we offer responsive and personalised support. Our 'open-door' policy means you can seek out advice, guidance and support from both our student support services and our academics whenever you need to.

Personal Development Tutor

We assign every student a Personal Development Tutor (PDT) during the first few weeks. You can check in with them and ask questions confidentially about study, life, or anything else. Whatever you may need, your PDT will help you find the right support.

Academic Skills support

From managing your new workload to essay writing and exam preparation, we'll support you to become an effective, independent learner, so you can get the most out of your studies. We offer regular skills tutorials and online workshops, or you can arrange a personal advice session with an Academic Skills Adviser. There are also online resources and our Get Ready website with tips and advice from our students, all of which will help to build your academic and study skills.

ENSA advice

Edinburgh Napier Students' Association (ENSA) provides a free, independent, confidential and professional advice service for Edinburgh Napier students. It offers one-to-one advice on welfare rights issues such as accommodation, funding and fees as well as issues relating to your course, such as academic appeals and University rules and regulations.

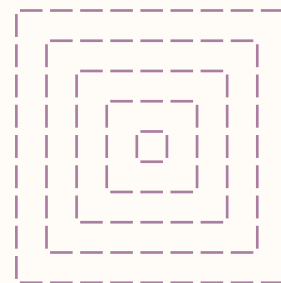

HOW TO APPLY

Full-time courses

Applying for our full-time undergraduate courses is done through the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS) website (ucas.com). You should use the Edinburgh Napier institution code – ENAP E59 – along with the code of the course you'd like to study, you'll find this on the course webpage.

Part-time courses and online courses

Are you a UK student and want to study part-time? Or online? To do this, you'll have to go through our website. Just visit the page of your chosen course and hit the 'apply' button.

Year 2/Year 3 - Point of Entry

On your UCAS application you will be asked to select your point of entry. The default is year 1. Direct Entry students with the appropriate qualification to apply to Year 2 or 3 will need to change their UCAS point of entry:

"2" For Year 2

"3" For Year 3

Applying for September 2026? Applications close 14 January 2026. UCAS will forward your application to us. We will reply on or before 13 May 2026. If you receive an offer, check your application to see what date you need to accept it by. Forgetting to accept by the deadline will release your place. Remember to give your college lecturers plenty of notice if you choose them as your reference!

If you miss this deadline, you can still apply to us through UCAS, however popular courses may be full and will close for applications.



We will review your qualifications, personal statement and supporting references. Our Admissions policies, which you can find online, provide advice about how we select.

You will receive a response with either an unconditional offer, a conditional offer, or informing you that unfortunately your application has been unsuccessful.

We make offers from November to mid-May.

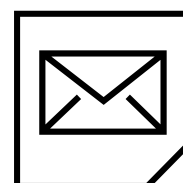

If your offer is conditional, we will confirm your place when your outstanding conditions are met, which could include obtaining certain qualifications.



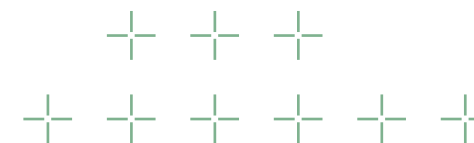
You will be sent information about your timetable from August. Get in the habit of regularly checking your emails from May - August for details of induction sessions. We will look forward to you commencing your studies with us in September.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

We offer a range of scholarships, bursaries and funding to help you study with us



Head over to **napier.ac.uk/UG-funding** to see exactly what you are eligible for and how to apply.



Through a scholarship or a bursary award, you can receive a sum of money to support you while you study with us which you won't need to pay back.

Depending on the specific award's eligibility criteria, funding can support living costs, childcare expenses, tuition fees or a specific project that is beneficial to your academic and personal development. So it is well worth checking out what financial assistance you might be eligible for.

Here's an idea of what financial support can do:

- Cover the costs of course fees.
- Help with living costs.
- Enable travel, research or aid personal development.
- Help you take a passion further, such as sports or the arts.
- Support a start-up business dream.

Bursaries and scholarships explained

A bursary will be given to you automatically if you meet certain criteria; for example, if you come from a low-income household. You don't need to apply for these bursaries, we will let you know if you are eligible when you confirm you will be starting your course with us.

To receive a scholarship, you may have to submit a separate application and the process can be competitive or distributed on a first-come first-served basis, so it's important to apply early.

There are special scholarships available to help with specific projects as part of your course, such as if you decide to study abroad, or do a research project locally. There are also elite athlete and country-specific scholarships available.

UK (from outside Scotland) and Republic of Ireland Students

Students from England, Northern Ireland, Wales, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man and the Republic of Ireland are generally classified as Rest of UK/ROI for fees purposes, and are able to access specific support including:

Access and Merit bursaries

We provide a generous bursary package offering a cash award of up to £3,000 per year (dependent on your financial circumstances and/or your academic achievement).

Fee Waiver

The majority of undergraduate degrees in Scotland last four years (compared to three years elsewhere in the UK), providing greater breadth and opportunities within your course. When studying with us this means, for example, that there is usually the opportunity to undertake work-related experience as part of your course. All eligible students on courses of four years or more in length will automatically receive a single year fee waiver. This will typically be applied in your final year of studies, except where you undertake an exchange abroad or work placement where the fee waiver will be applied during the year this takes place.

Access to other funding

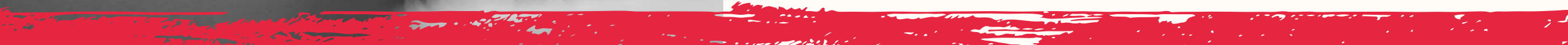
Our team of Student Funding advisers work to support all eligible students to apply for additional sources of funding, including Discretionary and Childcare, and can provide advice on how best to manage on a budget.

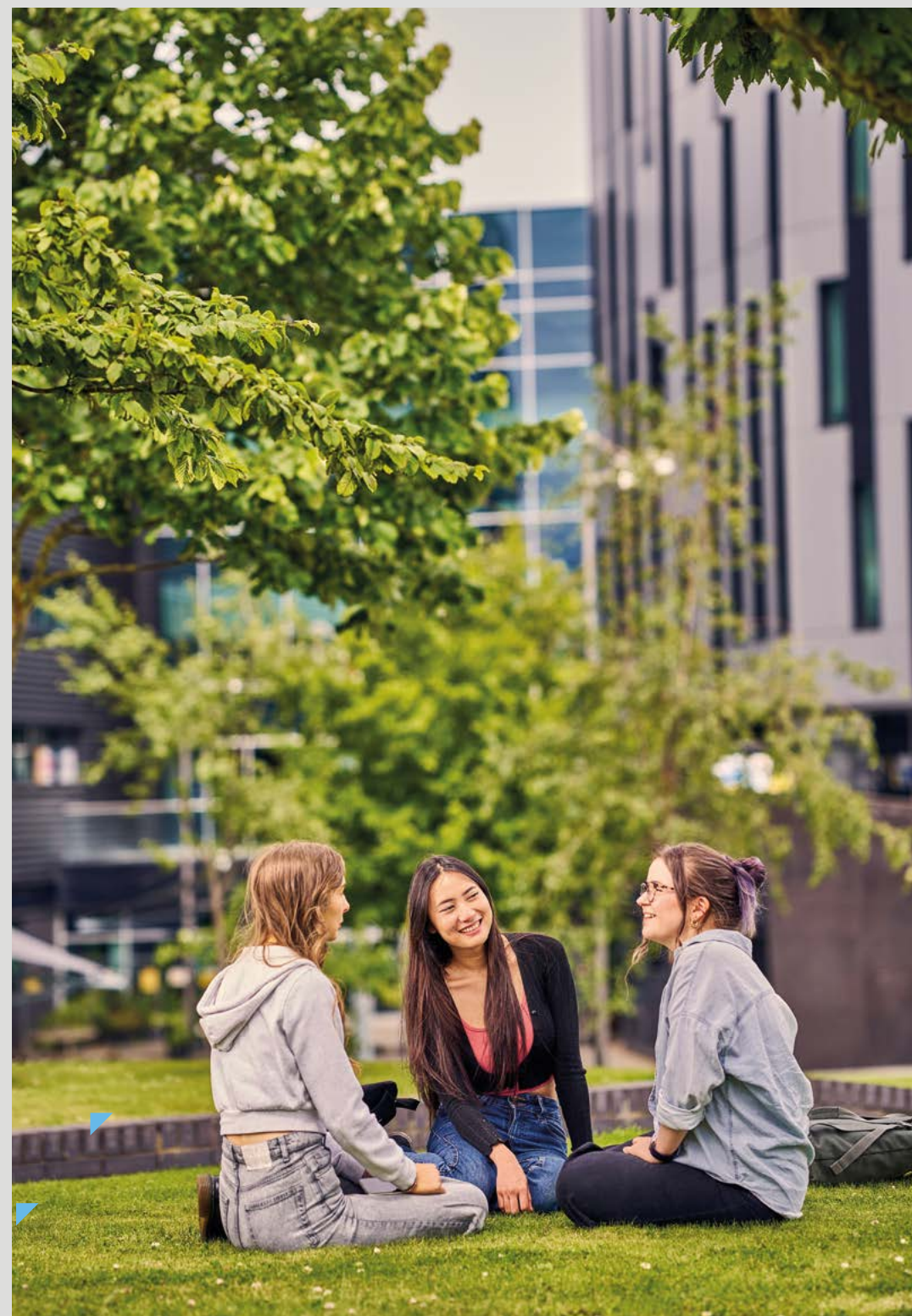
