Edinburgh is home to the world's largest arts festival, the Edinburgh Festival Fringe.




You can study a range of research degrees with us, all of which provide training in research, enhance your employment opportunities and allow you to develop advanced skills and expertise in a specific area of interest.



APPLYING

What are the entry requirements?

Entry requirements vary from course to course. You can find specific entry requirements for your country on our website:

If your country is not listed, please contact us and we will be happy to share the specific requirements with you.

If English is not your first language you may also need to undertake an approved English language test. Find out more: www.napier.ac.uk/english-language

How do I apply for undergraduate study?

All applications for our undergraduate courses are handled by the University and College Admissions Service (UCAS):

ucas.com

This is a central UK application system and you can apply for five different course choices in one application.

How do I apply for postgraduate study?

Applications for postgraduate study are made directly to the University using our online application system. Apply online by choosing your course from our website. It is important to note that many of our postgraduate programmes have start dates in both September and January. The majority of our postgraduate courses do not have a strict application deadline but you should aim to submit by the end of June for the September intake and by the end of November for the January intake.

Some of our most popular programmes have limited places. You will be advised how to secure your place once we make you an offer.

Many of the postgraduate courses have an option to start in January. Are there advantages to this?

For a January start date you will generally study from January-April, then break for the summer. You'll study again from September-December and complete your degree from January-April the following year. There are several advantages to starting your programme in January, including being in Edinburgh over the summer to take advantage of the city's famous festivals. You'll also be able to use the summer to find valuable part-time or full-time work, work experience or an internship to boost your career.

Who can help me with my application?

Our International team is here to help you all the way. However, we also have offices in China, India, Malaysia, Nigeria, Pakistan and the USA and a network of local representatives across the globe who can offer you advice and assistance on applying to study with us. ENGLISH LANGUAGE

English is not my first language. Can you help me improve my English language skills before I join?

Yes. Our English for Academic Purposes pre-sessional courses support you to improve your English and academic study skills. We also provide you with practical help to settle into life in a new city, including the opportunity to immerse yourself in Edinburgh and Scotland's culture through visits to tourist attractions. Is there any English language support available once I've joined the University?

We offer support right through your time with us, with English language and study skills workshops as well as individual appointments available free of charge to all enrolled international students. These include writing workshops, discussion and presentation skills workshops, individual help sessions and pronunciation laboratories.



VISAS

Do I need a visa to study at Edinburgh Napier University?

International students, including EU/ EEA students but excluding Republic of Ireland students, looking to study with us in 2023/24 will need to have immigration permission. This will usually be through the Student Visa route or the EU Settlement Scheme. Please note, the Student Visa has replaced the previous Tier 4 (General) student visa.

What do I need to get a Student Visa?

Visa requirements typically include:

- an unconditional offer to a full-time bachelors, masters or research degree in the UK;
- a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) from the University confirming your offer, academic qualifications and English language level;
- total tuition fees and nine months of living costs held in your bank account for a 28-day period.

UK Visas and Immigration may update this information periodically so check our website for up-to-date requirements. We provide a range of helpful guides on how to apply for your student visa on our website.

Can someone help me with my visa application?

Of course. Our trained immigration advisors sit in our International Support team and are happy to help you with all questions related to visas.

They can give you lots of advice about completing the Student Visa application before coming to the UK and also offer drop-in sessions while you are enrolled in case you have to extend your current immigration permission.

How much does it cost to study at Edinburgh Napier?

At the time of going to press, we're still in the process of setting international fees for 2023/24. Please refer to our website where detailed tuition fee information will be made available as soon as possible:

Note that tuition fees are subject to change and there may be an annual increment in the cost of tuition fees while you are at the University taking into account the following circumstances:

- any increases set or prescribed by regulatory bodies (other than the University) such as the Student Awards Agency for Scotland (SAAS) and the UK Government and/or
- changes to the cost of delivering our programmes. Factors taken into account include inflationary measures such as the retail price index (RPI), projected increases in university costs, changes in the level of grant from the Scottish Funding Council, costs of provision of teaching, supervision and course-related facilities.

How do I pay my fees?

If you're paying your own fees you will pay your fees directly to the University.

You will need to pay a deposit of £3,500 to secure your place on the course. You may be able to pay your fees in instalments depending on your course and payment method.

If your fees are being paid by a sponsor, you can either pay these direct to the University or your sponsor can be invoiced for the cost of your tuition each year. For more information, visit our website:

How much does it cost to live in Edinburgh?

UK Visas and Immigration determine living costs outside of London as £1,023 per month. This is the amount that they will require you to show in your Student Visa application.

In our experience, living costs in Edinburgh are similar or a bit higher than this amount (see page 28) but students have great opportunities to receive discounts in shops, cinemas, theatres, museums and much more.

Will I be able to work during my studies?

Yes, getting a part-time job is a great way to keep the cost of living in Edinburgh down while studying.

There are lots of opportunities for parttime work in the city. The University
runs a Student Ambassador programme
which will allow you to become more
involved in university life while making
extra money. Within Edinburgh itself,
there are opportunities for part-time
work – retail, hospitality (restaurants,
cafés and bars), tourism (hotels, tours
and museums), cinemas, theatres, call
centres and other office-based work.
Our Student Futures team can help you
work on your CV when you enrol at the
University and will be able to assist you
with looking for part-time work.

Remember, if you are studying with us on a visa, check the regulations for the maximum number of hours that you can work per week.





OK, I'm all set to come to Edinburgh Napier University. Can you help me when I arrive?

Ahead of your arrival, we will send you a pre-arrival guide to help you prepare for your travel to Edinburgh and to ensure you reach the university smoothly. We also hold international student induction sessions in September and January – these are a great way to meet other students and pick up key information to make your time at the University enjoyable and successful.
