WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Our Admissions Team will review your application and if your application is successful, we will make one of the following decisions:

UNCONDITIONAL OFFER

Some of our courses require a portfolio or interview before we can make our decision. If this applies to you, we will be in touch with details.

After you receive decisions from all your choices, you will need to make your choices on UCAS by:
10 June (if you receive all decisions by 20 May) | **14 July** (if you receive all decisions by 13 July)

CONDITIONAL OFFER

Once you have made your firm and insurance choices, remember to apply for **fees and finance!**

If your offer is **unconditional** decide on:

- ▶ **FIRM CHOICE**
This will be your first choice and preferred course of study. All other offers will be declined by UCAS.
- ▶ **INSURANCE CHOICE**
You can choose an unconditional offer as your insurance choice, in case you don't meet the conditions of your firm choice.

If your offer is **conditional** decide on:

- ▶ **FIRM CHOICE**
This will be your first choice and preferred course of study.
- ▶ **INSURANCE CHOICE**
This will be your back-up choice just in case you don't meet the conditions of your firm choice.

RESULTS DAY

If your offer is conditional on Higher/Advanced Higher or A Levels, we will receive your final results from UCAS and you will be able to see if your place has been confirmed when you log into UCAS Track.

You will need to provide Admissions with scanned copies of your results if you are taking other qualifications such as National 5, HNC, HND, BTEC, IB, etc. before they can confirm your place.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Below are a few frequently asked questions. You'll probably have more, so make sure you ask them at the Virtual Applicant Day or get in touch with us.

How long will it take to receive a decision on my application?

We know this is an exciting time and we will aim to make a decision as quickly as possible. If you submitted your application by the 29 January deadline, we must make our decision no later than 20 May. If you have applied for a popular subject area, we may hold your application until we have considered all applications which were submitted by the 29 January deadline. This is to ensure that all applications submitted by the deadline are given fair and equal consideration.

Can I change the course I have applied for?

This depends on the individual course. Provided that you meet the minimum entry requirements for the course and if there are still places available, we will try to accommodate changes. However, this cannot be guaranteed.

I want to drop one of the subjects I am studying at school - will this affect my application?

Where possible, please speak to our Admissions Team first before dropping any of your subjects. They will look at your application and advise of any impact which dropping a subject may have on your application to study with us.

What if I don't meet the conditions of my offer – will I still get in?

This depends on the results which other applicants have received. If there have been personal circumstances which you think have had an impact on your performance, you should send details to our Admissions Team. This should also include a supporting statement from your school/college and will be considered alongside your grades.

I requested deferred entry, but now want to come this year. Is this possible?

You will need to contact us to discuss this, we will only be able to accommodate this request if there are still places available on the course. Send our Admissions Team an email who will look into it and get back to you as soon as possible.

My circumstances have changed and I no longer want to go to university/no longer want to go to university this year, what should I do?

Please get in touch with our Admissions Team by email to let us know and discuss your options. If you have decided you no longer wish to go to university you can also decline your offer through UCAS Track who will inform the university.
