Bright Red Triangle is our business incubator. It matches our brilliant students with the support and space they need to get their business ideas off the ground.

The latest business to sprout from Bright Red Triangle is lil'POP, the brainchild of Sydney Chasin. Sydney's bright idea came about as the result of her honours dissertation for her degree in Financial Services with Entrepreneurship. Whilst interviewing young entrepreneurs in Scotland, she was inspired:

"Each and every one of them had a unique and invigorating story. They inspired me to embark on this entrepreneurial journey. I came up with this idea off the back of trying the US version of popped sorghum in Washington D.C. and realising the UK popcorn market is booming!"

Since graduating, she has operated her business from Edinburgh Napier's Bright

Red Triangle business incubator, winning support and financial funding from a host of sources, including The Royal Society of Edinburgh, Scottish Enterprise, the Scottish Institute for Enterprise, and, most recently, a £10,000 award from the Scottish EDGE competition.

Sydney is grateful to have business support on a daily basis.

"Bright Red Triangle has been amazing. Every organisation I've worked with has contributed to me getting to this point, but the team at Bright Red Triangle have been there from the very start.

"I've worked from the incubator since 2016, and now I'm using it to grow my team. I've made it my




ENSA is an independent, student-led charity created to support and improve your student experience, with everything from sports and societies, to volunteering, advice and representation.




Step 2: With the patterned side facing up, fold all four corners into the centre.




